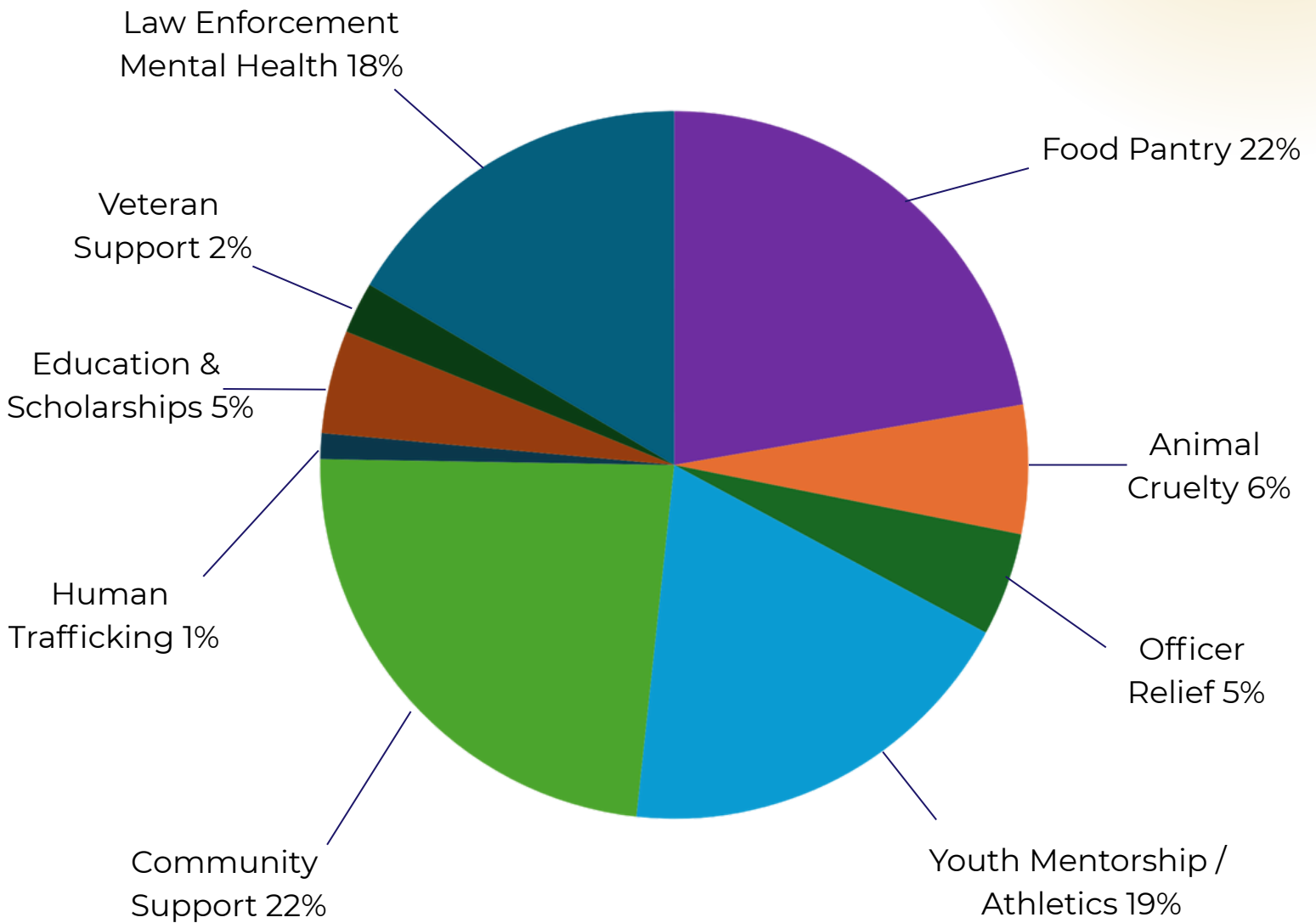

# **A Critical Priority: Law Enforcement Mental Health**

## ***The Urgency of Officer Mental Health: Protecting those Who Protect Us***

**The mental health crisis facing law enforcement is both professionally and personally urgent.**

**The demands of the profession- chronic stress, trauma exposure, high-stakes decision-making, and cultural stigma take a profound toll on those who serve.**

# A Critical Priority: Law Enforcement Mental Health

## Stark Reality:

- Police officers are **more likely to die by suicide** than in the line of duty.

- Every year, more law enforcement officers, firefighters and corrections workers are **lost to suicide** than to on-duty crashes, accidents and assaults combined.

# Struggle Well Training Program

In 2021, the CPR Foundation, in partnership with the Boulder Crest Foundation, launched the **Struggle Well Training Program** in Miami-Dade County.

The program is grounded in the philosophy of **post-traumatic growth** and designed specifically to address the unique mental and emotional challenges faced by law enforcement through both *prevention and intervention*.

To date, **more than 3,500 first responders across 37 municipalities and departments** in South Florida have completed the training.

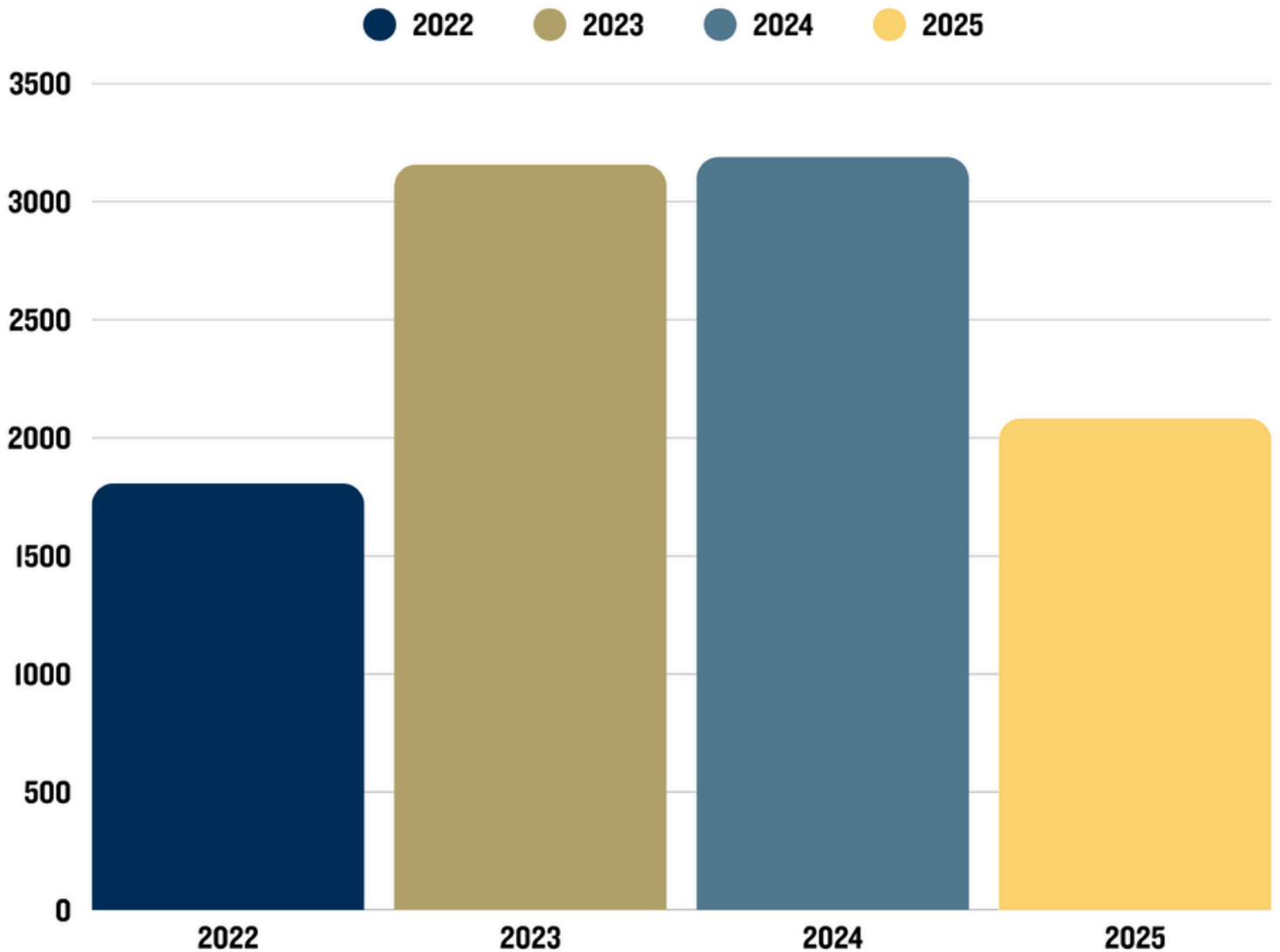

# Struggle Well Training Program: Officers Trained

In 2025, the number of training sessions and participants in Florida decreased modestly as Struggle Well transitioned from early pilot expansion to a more stable, statewide delivery model. This change reflects the conclusion of funding support for a northern Florida partner and the completion of intensive early implementation in Miami-Dade, where Struggle Well was first launched.

As the program matured, delivery shifted from rapid expansion to sustaining high-quality, in-person, training while preparing for targeted growth in new regions.

# Struggle Well Training Program

Participant feedback has been overwhelmingly positive, with an **aggregate satisfaction score of 4.99 out of 5** underscoring both the relevance and impact of the program.

# Multi-Agency Peer Support Team Program

Recognizing that training alone is not enough, the CPR Foundation launched the **Multi-Agency Peer Support Team Program** in 2023 to provide **immediate, confidential, peer-to-peer support** to officers and their families.

This program is staffed by a trusted network of **certified law enforcement officers and chaplains** who understand the realities of the job. The team provides support related to work stress, critical incidents, emotional wellbeing, and family challenges, often at moments when intervention is most critical.

# Multi-Agency Peer Support Team Program

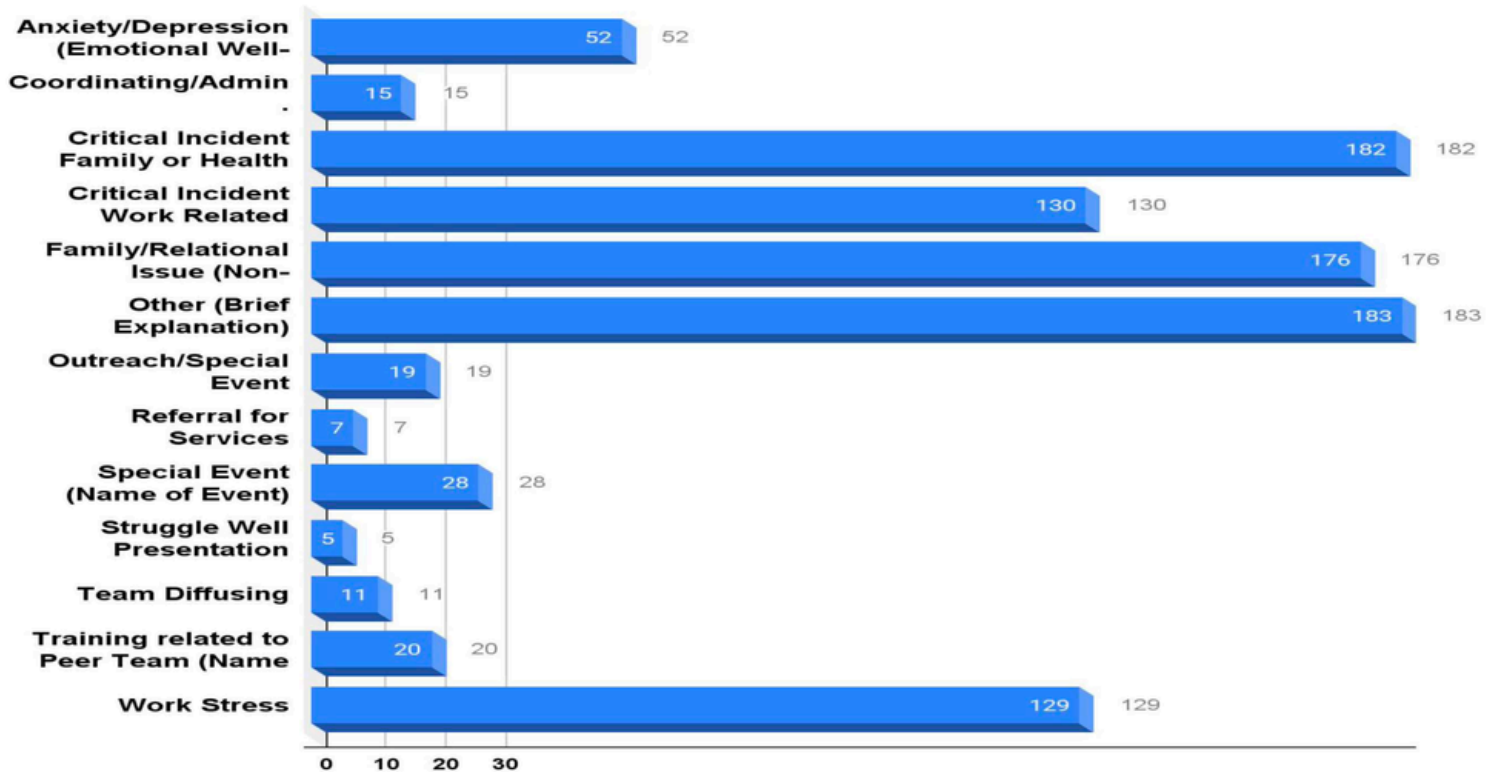

Building on its commitment to officer wellbeing, the CPR Foundation expanded its mental health strategy in 2025 by partnering with the **Boundless Leadership Development Certification Program.**

This program strengthens both **personal resilience and professional leadership**, equipping current and emerging leaders with the mindset, skills, and tools needed to navigate change, foster innovation, enhance employee engagement, and drive operational success.

# Boundless Leadership-CPR Foundation Development Certification Program

With a focus on **self-care, communication, resiliency, and emotional intelligence**, the program also helps build a sustainable pipeline of future leaders, ensuring that wellness and accountability are embedded into the culture of law enforcement.

Instruction is led by **PhD-level faculty**, providing research-based, practical insights that translate directly to the field.

Also attached is a photo collage of our program in action, with thousands of students being awarded for doing the right thing this year.

Since 1990, Do The Right Thing has recognized thousands of students for their exemplary behavior, accomplishments, and good deeds in conjunction with local law enforcement. Each month up to 1,000 nominees are rewarded with t-shirts, certificates of recognition, bumper stickers, free pizzas from Papa John's, tickets to a Miami Marlins game, and letters of congratulations from the Chief of Police. In addition, the program awards an annual scholarship to the Miami Police Academy and awards top student winners trips to Rapids Water Park and Washington, D.C. Now more than ever, the Do The Right Thing program proves a valuable tool in promoting a safe school environment as we continue encouraging students to do the right thing and speak up to protect the wellbeing of their school and peers.

We are proud to have such wonderful community support and I look forward to our continued partnership as we keep working to impact our youth.

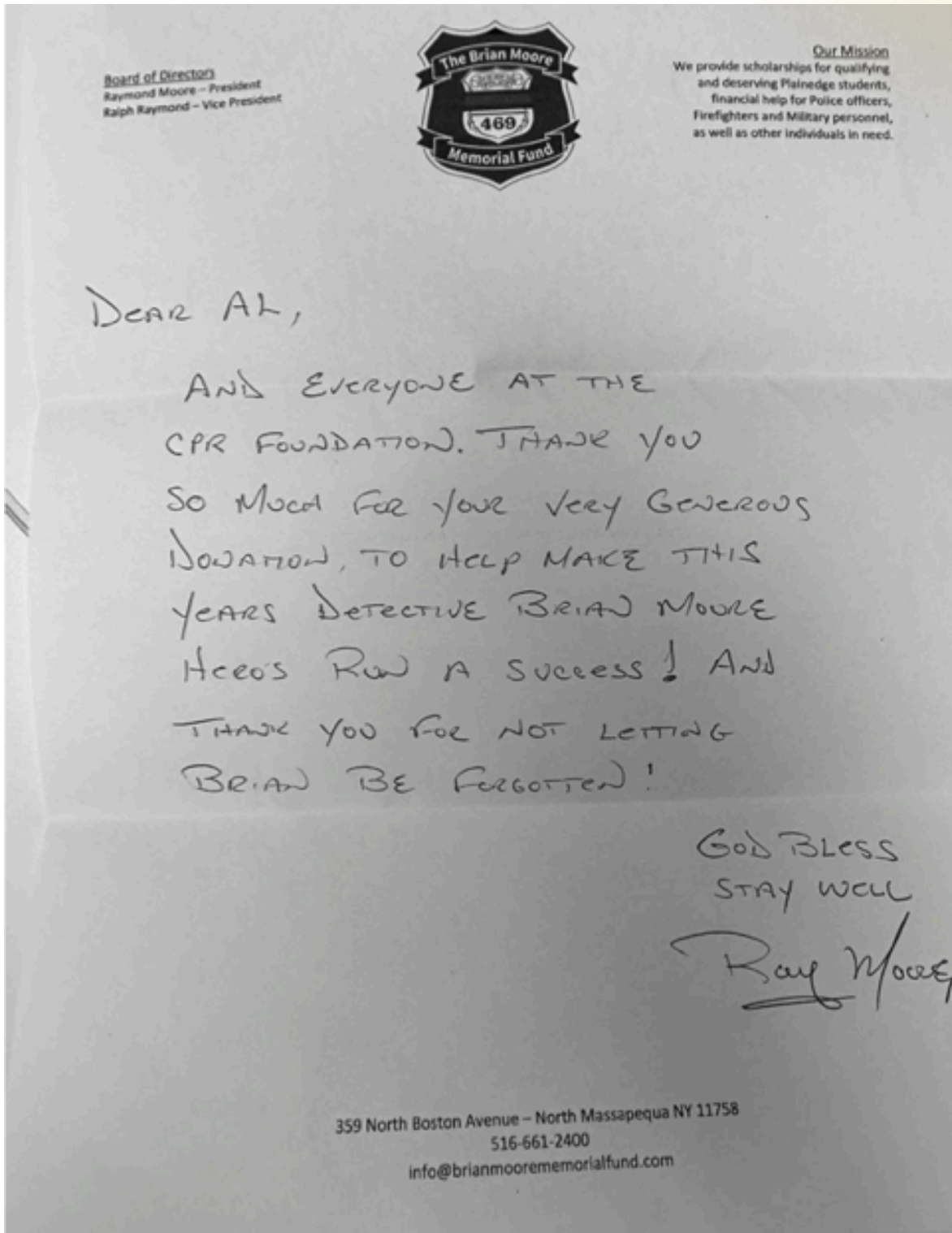

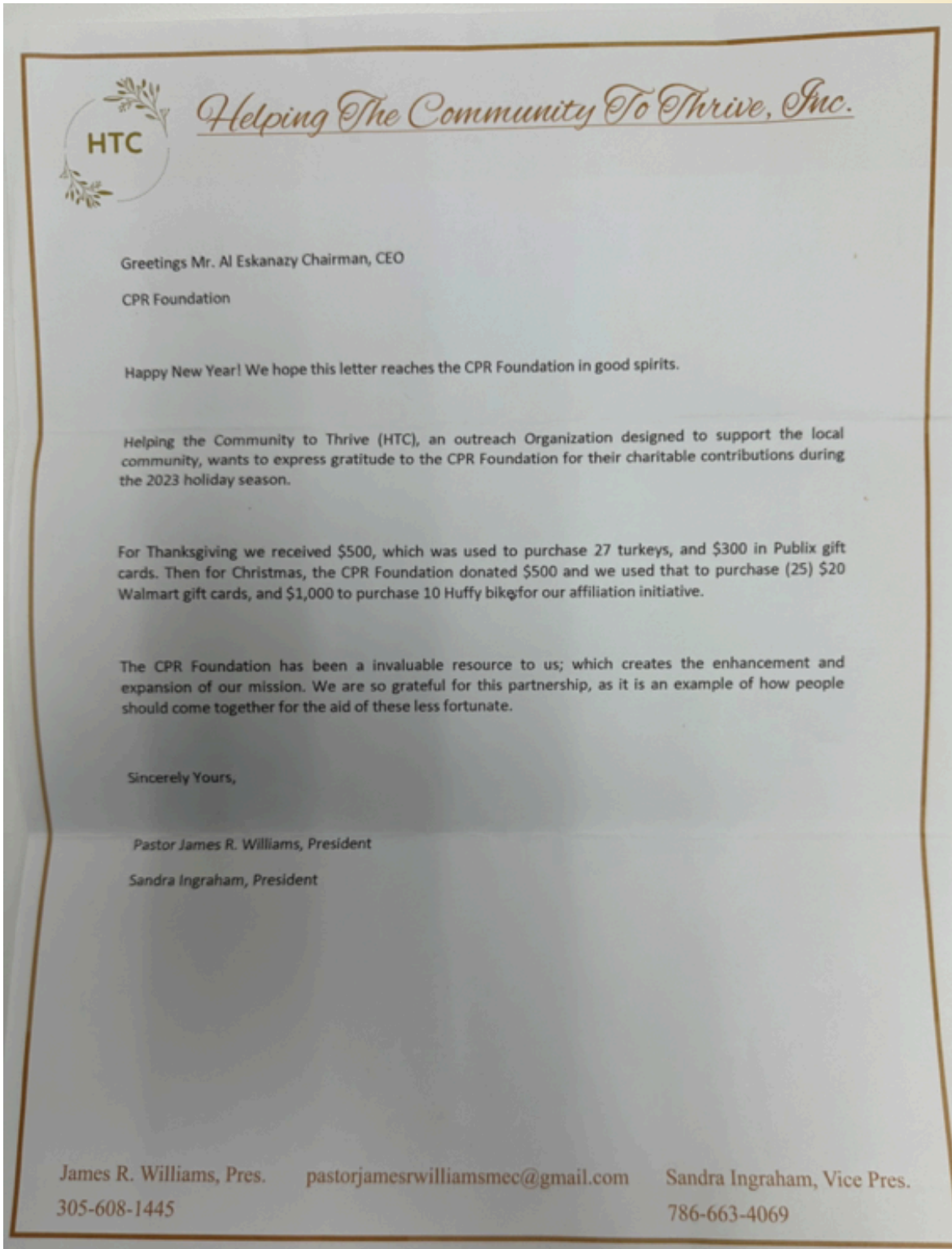
