CPRF Receives Do The Right Thing Award




On June 15th, Do The Right Thing Miami hosted their Summer Salute Awards Ceremony where CPRF received the annual mentor award.


CPRF is a proud sponsor of the annual LEO Weekend in New York City. LEO Weekend (Foundation) works with the families of injured and fallen law enforcement officers, providing all-expenses-paid weekend getaways and other family-friendly events.

CPRF also helped to purchase a new 15-passenger vehicle that will be utilized for the families of injured and fallen officers. The van will be used for transporting families to and from medical appointments, gravesite visits, community events and special requests. Members of law enforcement will donate their time to drive the van.

On Thursday, August 25th, New York City Police Department hosted "A Night of Hope, Health and Understanding" which featured a discussion about CPRF's law enforcement mental health initiative.


Our collaboration with Boulder Crest Foundation, a PTG (post-traumatic growth) mental wellness initiative to facilitate mental health programs for police officers, spouses and first responders was shared. CPRF spoke of their last 20 months providing services to over 1,800 police officers in 37 police departments throughout Miami-Dade County. We continue to receive positive feedback from officers and department chiefs.

Studies have shown that due to the traumatic experiences on the job, police officers are more at risk for stress disorders. Due to the stigma associated with mental health disorders, police officers are more likely to hide their symptoms and are less likely to seek treatment. Depression is the leading cause of suicide among police officers. Having a program that is proactive can not only potentially save their lives but also protect the public from potentially unsafe policing.

CPRF was in attendance at the annual ceremony that recognizes current Nassau County Police Explorers for their volunteer work in the community.

The Nassau County Police Exploring program is comprised of young adults who are exploring the field of law enforcement. The program provides career orientation experiences, leadership opportunities, and community service activities.
